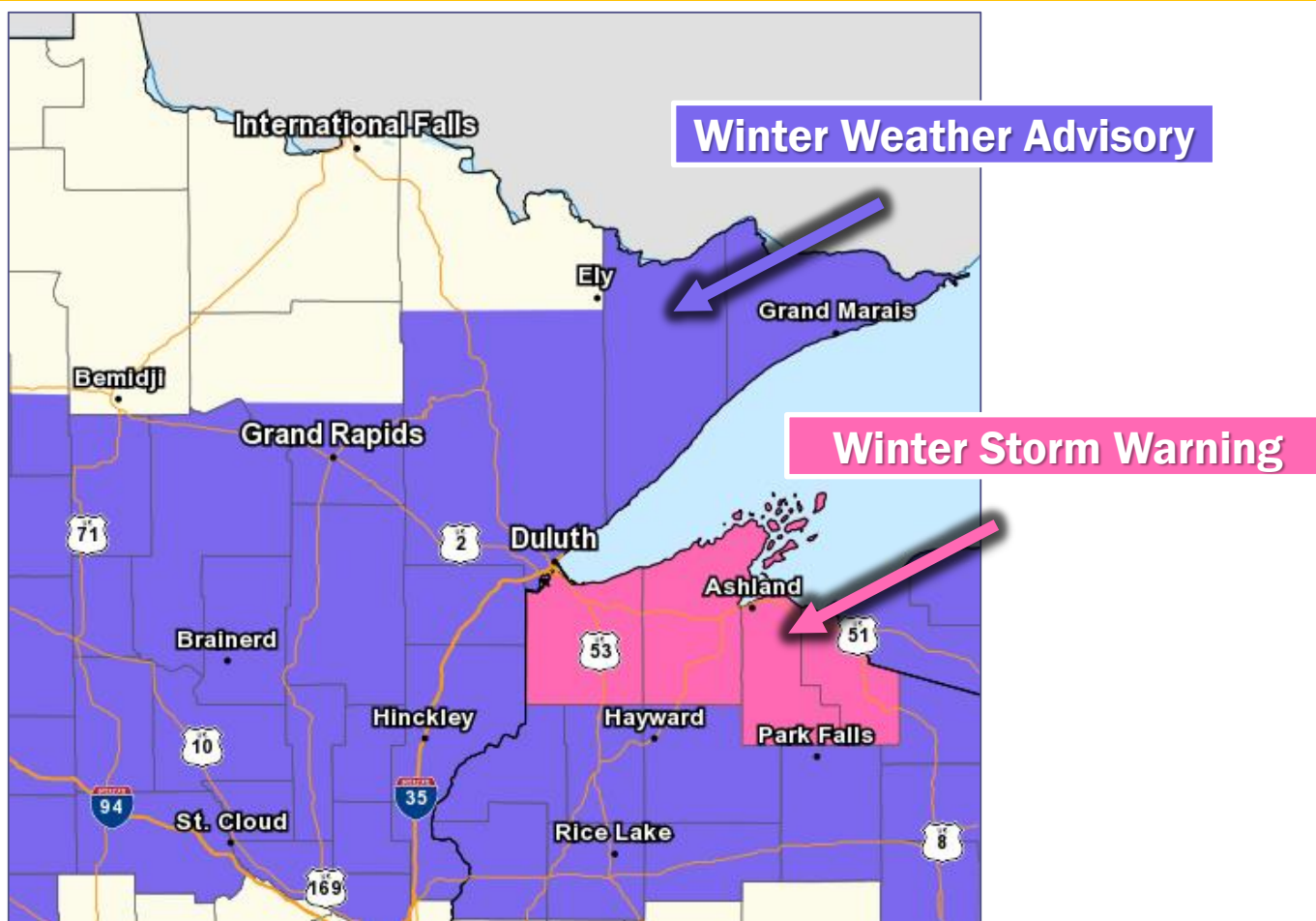


## Winter Storm Tonight & Tomorrow



### Message of the Day:

- Widespread snow, heavy at times, is expected tonight through Monday.
- Snow accumulation of 3 to 8 inches in the advisory area and 5 to 11 in the warning area.
- Snow will affect the Monday morning commute.

## Winter Storm Tonight & Tomorrow

### Key Points



**Hazards:** Snow, heavy at times.



**Areas Impacted:** Most of central, north-central, and northeast Minnesota. All of northwest Wisconsin.



**Timing & Duration:** Snow begins tonight in central Minnesota and overspreads the remainder of the Northland by sunrise Monday morning. A brief period of lake effect snow is possible this evening along the South Shore. The snow will affect the Monday morning commute.



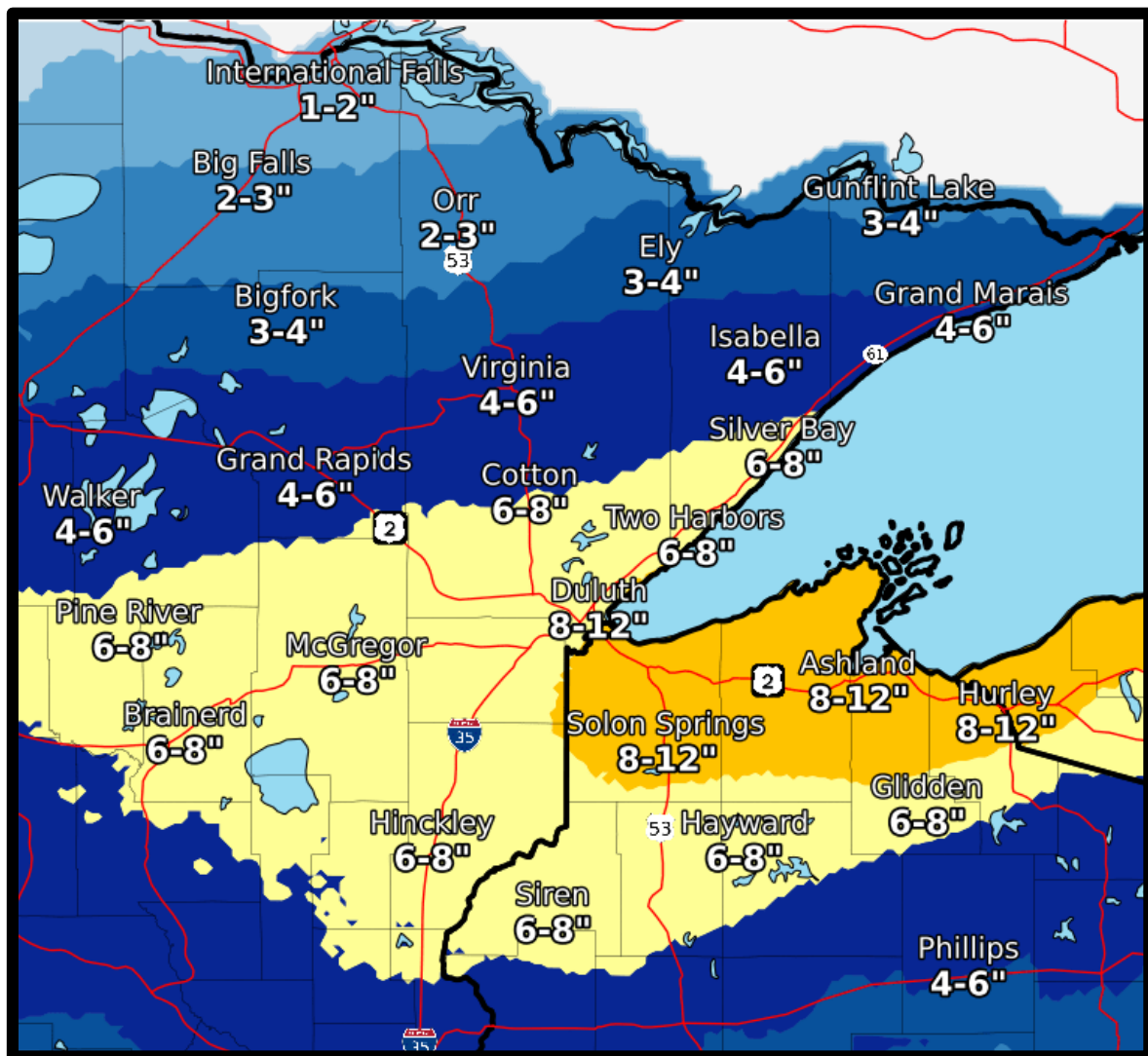
**Impacts:** Roads will become snow-covered and slippery. Visibility will be reduced. Heavy snow and strong winds along the South Shore may lead to isolated power outages.



**Certainty & Considerations:** Additional areas may need to be added to the warning with later updates. Confidence in snow totals in the advisory area is high. Confidence in the warning area is medium-high. Snow totals in Douglas, Bayfield, Ashland, and Iron counties may need to be enhanced due to lake effect snow. We are confident in at least 8 inches of snow for those areas.

## Snowfall Forecast



### Snow Begins

- 9 PM – 12 AM tonight west
- 12 – 6 AM Arrowhead and NW Wisconsin

### Worst Conditions

- 12 AM – 6 AM west and north
- 6 AM – Noon NW Wisconsin

### Snow Ends

- 9 AM – Noon west and north
- Noon – 9 PM NW Wisconsin

## Winter Storm Tonight & Tomorrow

### Winter Hazard Definitions

- A **Winter Storm Warning** is issued when heavy snow or a combination of heavy snow, blowing snow, and ice is expected to impact the area. Avoid traveling if possible! Time to act!
- A **Winter Weather Advisory** is issued when snow or a combination of snow, blowing snow, and some ice is expected to impact the area. Use caution while traveling!

### Winter Weather Preparedness

- Winterize your car, and be sure to include a winter driving safety kit!
- Restock your emergency kit at home with batteries, food, water, etc.
- If you have a generator, make sure it is working – and **NEVER** run a generator in an enclosed space like a garage!
