On Tuesday, March 28, 2017, at 11:58 p.m. the Barron County Sheriff's Department dispatch received a phone call from a resident on the E. Wisconsin Avenue block in the City of Barron reporting that a juvenile male was missing from the residence. The Barron County Sheriff's Department Dispatch advised the City of Barron Police Department about the incident and an Incident Command Center was established at the First Lutheran Church to organize the search for the missing juvenile.

The Barron Police Department, Barron County Sheriff's Department and ERT Team, Cameron Police Department, Rice Lake Police Department, Turtle Lake Police Department, Almena Fire Department, Barron Fire Department, Cameron Fire Department, Turtle Lake Fire Department, Mayo Clinic Health Systems Barron Ambulance, K9 ERT, North Star Search & Rescue, Wisconsin DNR Air Unit, Wisconsin Emergency Management and Wisconsin Civil Air Patrol participated in the search. Over 60 personnel were involved in the search.

It was discovered that juvenile had exited out a rear door of the residence. K9 teams and search teams were deployed and a systematic search of the City was conducted. On Wednesday, March 29, 2017, at 6:57 a.m. the Barron County Sheriff's Department Dispatch Center received a phone call from a City of Barron resident which led to finding the missing juvenile near Portland Avenue and S. 3rd Street in the City of Barron. The juvenile was transported by ambulance to the Mayo Clinic Health Systems Barron for treatment at 7:18 a.m.

The incident remains under investigation by the Barron Police Department.
