Primary Election

Pursuant to Wis. Stats. §120.06(8)(c) and 10.01(2)(b) notice is hereby given to qualified electors of the School District of Shell Lake that a Spring Primary Election for the Board of Education will be held on Tuesday, February 15, 2022, at which the officers named below shall be nominated.

There are 7 candidates running for 3 Shell Lake Board of Education seats in the April election. The primary will decide the 6 candidates that appear on the Spring Election ballot.

There are no limitations to the number of open enrollment applications that can be submitted to a virtual charter school. 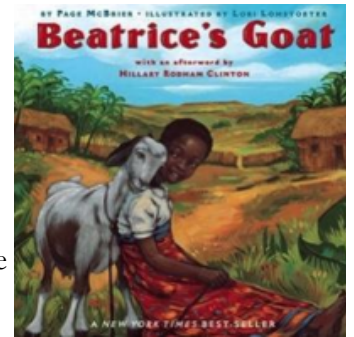
PK-6th Laker of the Week

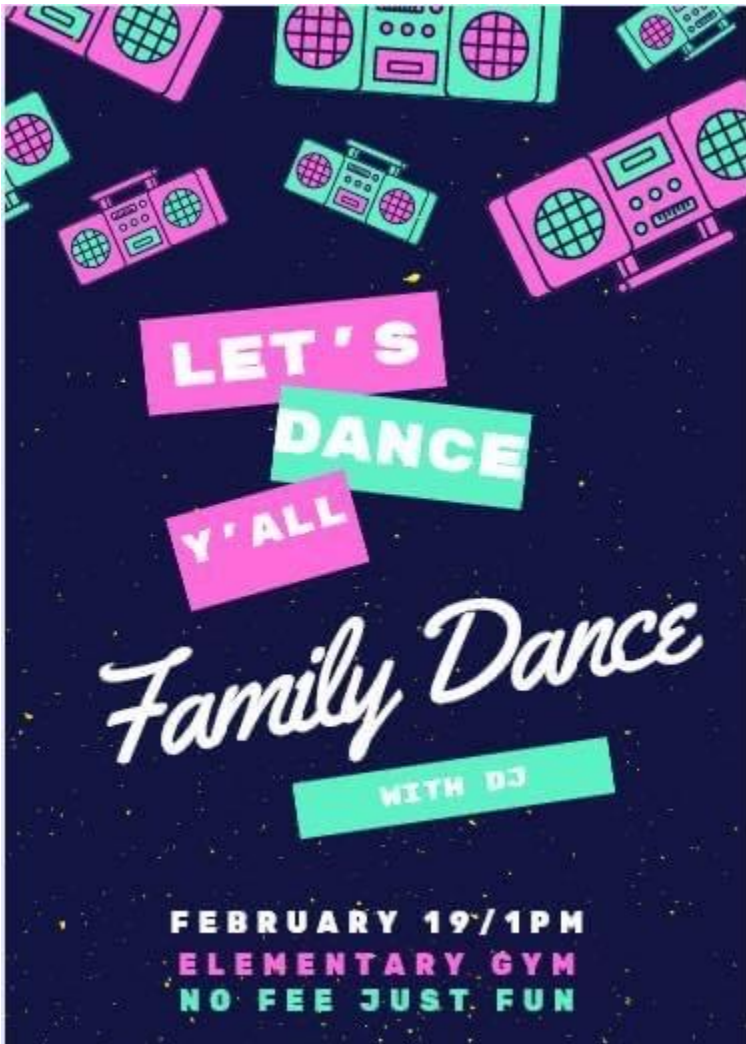
