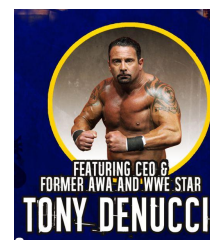

## FORWARD Testing Continues

In the next few weeks, students in grades 3-6 will be taking the Forward assessments for reading, language, writing and math. How do you help your child be successful with these testing days?

- Make sure your child gets a full night of sleep
- Get your child drinking plenty of water (water helps the brain do its hard work!)
- Give your child some positive affirmations in the morning. Here are some examples:
  - Your brain is so powerful! I can't wait to see what you know. You can do hard things. Show me your perseverance through this. You are so important to me. (This test does not determine your value)
- Prepare a healthy breakfast with some protein.
- Teach your child how to breathe through any anxieties they may have so they can have a calm brain.
- Send them off with a hug and a reminder that they are loved.

## Parenting Corner

### Emotional Contagion (aka parent self-care)

Have you ever noticed how a baby is drawn to his mother's face and mimics her expressions? Starting in infancy, children are inclined to share their parent's emotions- they sense and mimic the emotions of the adults close to them. If you are happy, they respond with a toothless grin at 6 months old or a giggle in elementary school because emotions can be contagious! If parents are stressed out, kids feel the tension and it creates stress in them too. When mom and dad are calm and patient, it trickles down to kids who feel at peace but when parents are overwhelmed (which is pretty natural these days), it impacts the children too. Don't feel bad if you're feeling stressed, overwhelmed or struggling, but definitely be aware of it (because your kids can sense it better than you imagine). This is just a great reminder to us as parents to maintain good self-care. Take a walk, listen to relaxing music, play with your pets, or whatever your healthy stress relief looks like - take care of your own mental health so you can be available to your family. Children do not need to know about all the worries in our world and cannot always process those adult stressors in the same way we can. Remember that our children will thrive when in an environment that is secure, happy, and peaceful.

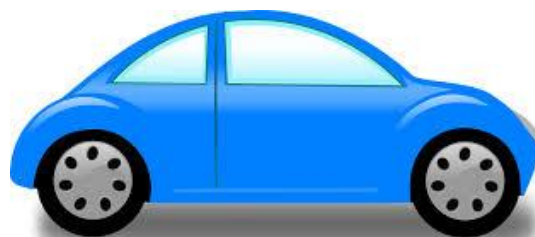

Wisconsin Help for Homeowners (WHH) is a new statewide program that can help with overdue bills like mortgage payments, property taxes, and utilities. The program is available to Wisconsin homeowners with overdue housing-related bills, both with and without a mortgage, who meet income and other eligibility requirements, and have experienced a qualified economic hardship since January 21, 2020. This \$92 million federally funded program provides a maximum of \$40,000 in assistance for eligible households.
