Parenting Corner

GRIT**

In 2013 Angela Duckworth shared her research on what she calls “grit” in a famous TED talk. When we look at what makes students successful in the long run, grit is a powerful factor that should be considered. I imagine grit as a mud-covered runner who just endured one of those tough mud challenges with obstacles embedded in the 5K race. The racer has to be willing to get a little dirty, climb difficult challenges and probably fall down a few times as they fail on certain obstacles. It’s a pretty good picture of real life grit - our kids need to be able to face things that look scary, take on challenges where they may fail, and accept the fact that they might not know what exactly is around the next corner. It’s all too easy to fall into a pattern of avoiding things that look difficult or to put off work that is a little confusing. Grit is a capacity to overcome that failure-avoidance and move forward anyways, looking for ways to learn from mistakes and grow through error. Did you know that Thomas Edison made over 10,000 prototypes before finding the best version of the light bulb? That’s what grit looks like - falling again and again but continuing to get back up and try again. Our kids can’t improve if they aren’t willing to face their mistakes and try, try again. 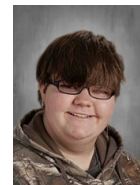

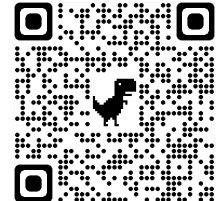

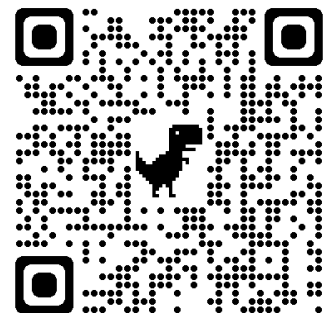
