Parenting Corner Heather Cox,

Talking to your children about scary things in the news...

It breaks my heart to have to write a parenting corner about how to respond as a parent to tragic events in our world. I think it's crucial that we do our best to protect our children's tender hearts from the horrible events that have happened recently. As you are having conversations with your children, remember that you are their safe person, the one who brings them a sense of security and trust. Be careful about how many details you share with children; it's best to ask them what they have heard and to address that instead of exposing them to more information than they need. I would highly recommend that you steer away from video footage on the news which may not be developmentally appropriate for children. It's ok to talk about how this situation has made you feel and to identify and address those emotions. When you first heard about what happened this week in Texas you most likely had a strong emotional reaction: sadness, fear, outrage, anxiety, and grief, to name a few. But, it's also crucial to remind children of the adults who are helpers in their community - the police, firefighters, leaders in our city, teachers and family members. Build up your child's sense of security by reminding them of safety protocols that are in place at school and in our community, such as police officers seen frequently around town and at the school, multiple locks on our entrances at school, and safety protocols in case of dangerous situations. Your children have a lot of caring people who are looking out for them and our number one priority is always their safety, both physically and psychologically. Give your kids an extra squeeze this week in gratitude that they are safe within your arms.

Upcoming Substitute Teacher Training



JULY 19 & JULY 20, 2022 | 8:00 AM - 3:30 PM | CESA #11 BOTH DAYS ARE REQUIRED

Anyone who holds an associate degree or higher from an accredited college or university has the opportunity to attend a two-part training to earn a three year WI Substitute Teacher License. This training will take place at the CESA #11 office in Turtle Lake. (A small amount of homework will need to be completed and turned in to the instructor before receiving your certificate of completion for the training.) This training will also include access to Foundations of Effective Substitute Teacher Training MasterTeacher Online Courses.



COST: \$230 * Payment is due at time of registration to secure your spot. License application is not included in the cost of the registration.
