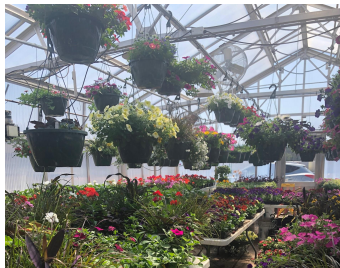
### Summer School

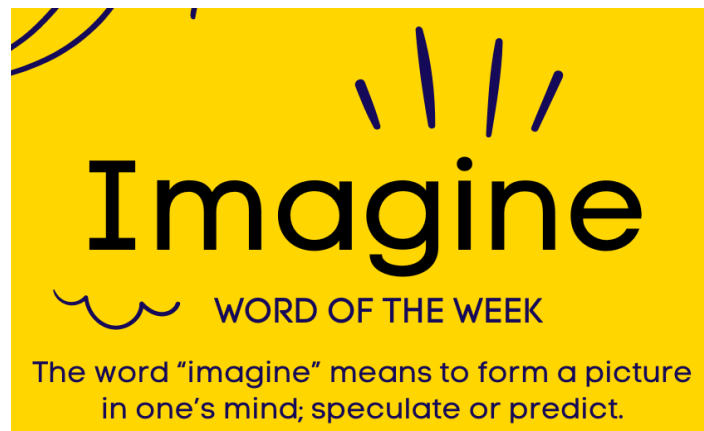

## Softball News

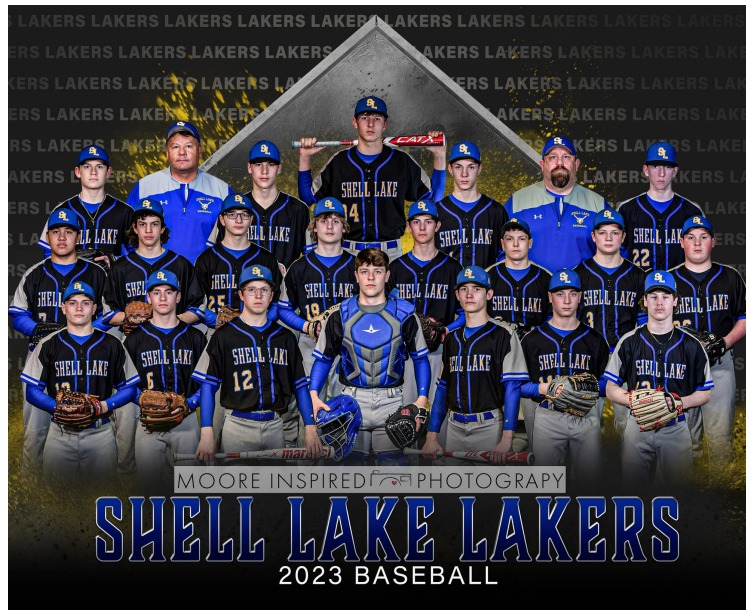


Chloe Zebro was selected to the Senior All Star Softball Series. This softball event invites the best Senior softball players from around the state to compete with other top seniors June 12th-13th
