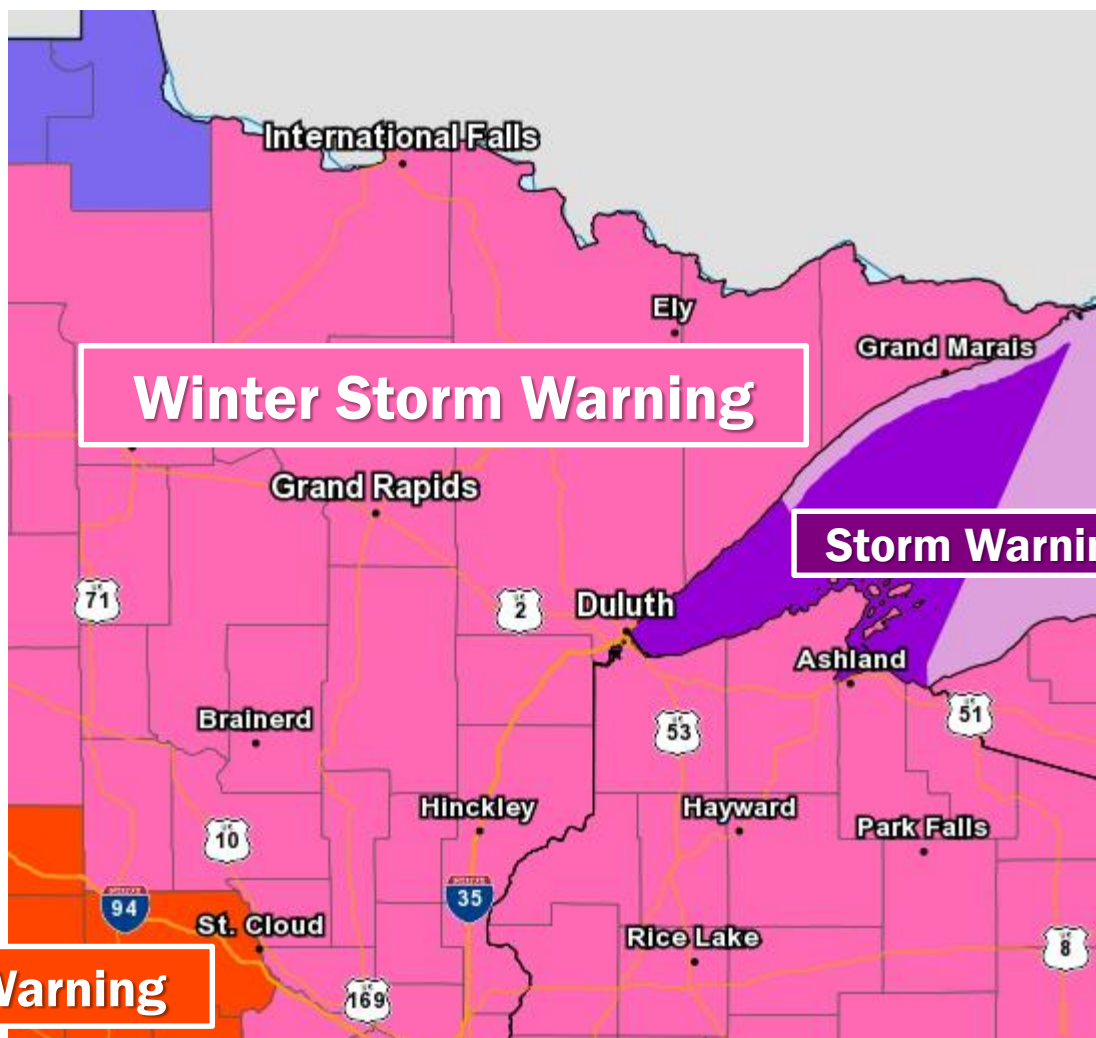


Potent Spring Snowstorm Today Through Friday



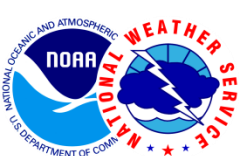
Message of the Day:

- A few rounds of heavy snow will track across the Northland today, mainly late morning and through the afternoon, impacting the evening commute
- Incredibly strong east-northeast winds gusting to 50-60mph, strongest along the Lake Superior shoreline

Snowfall amounts lowered slightly

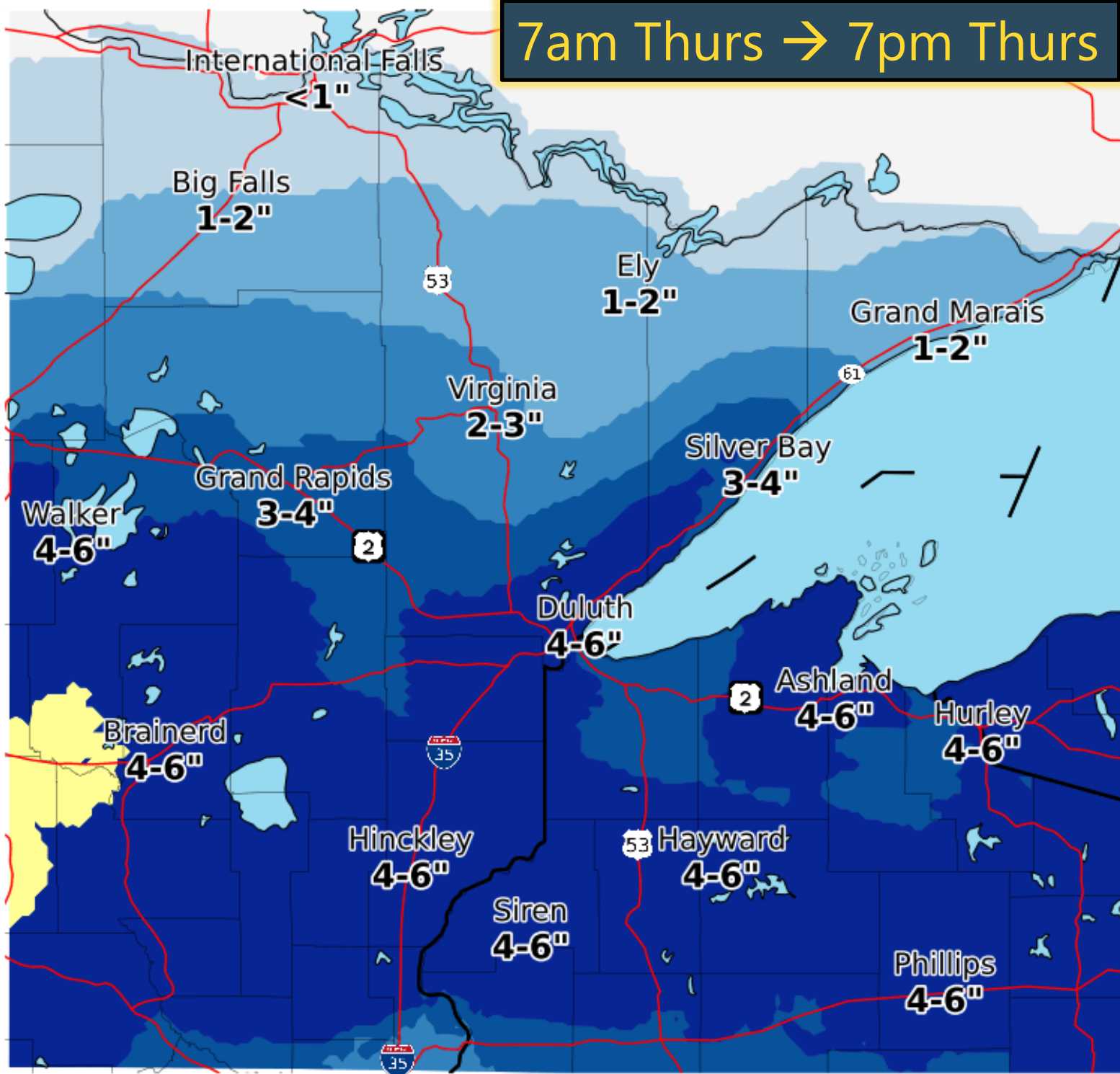

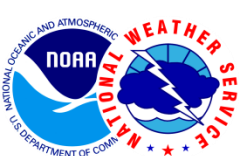

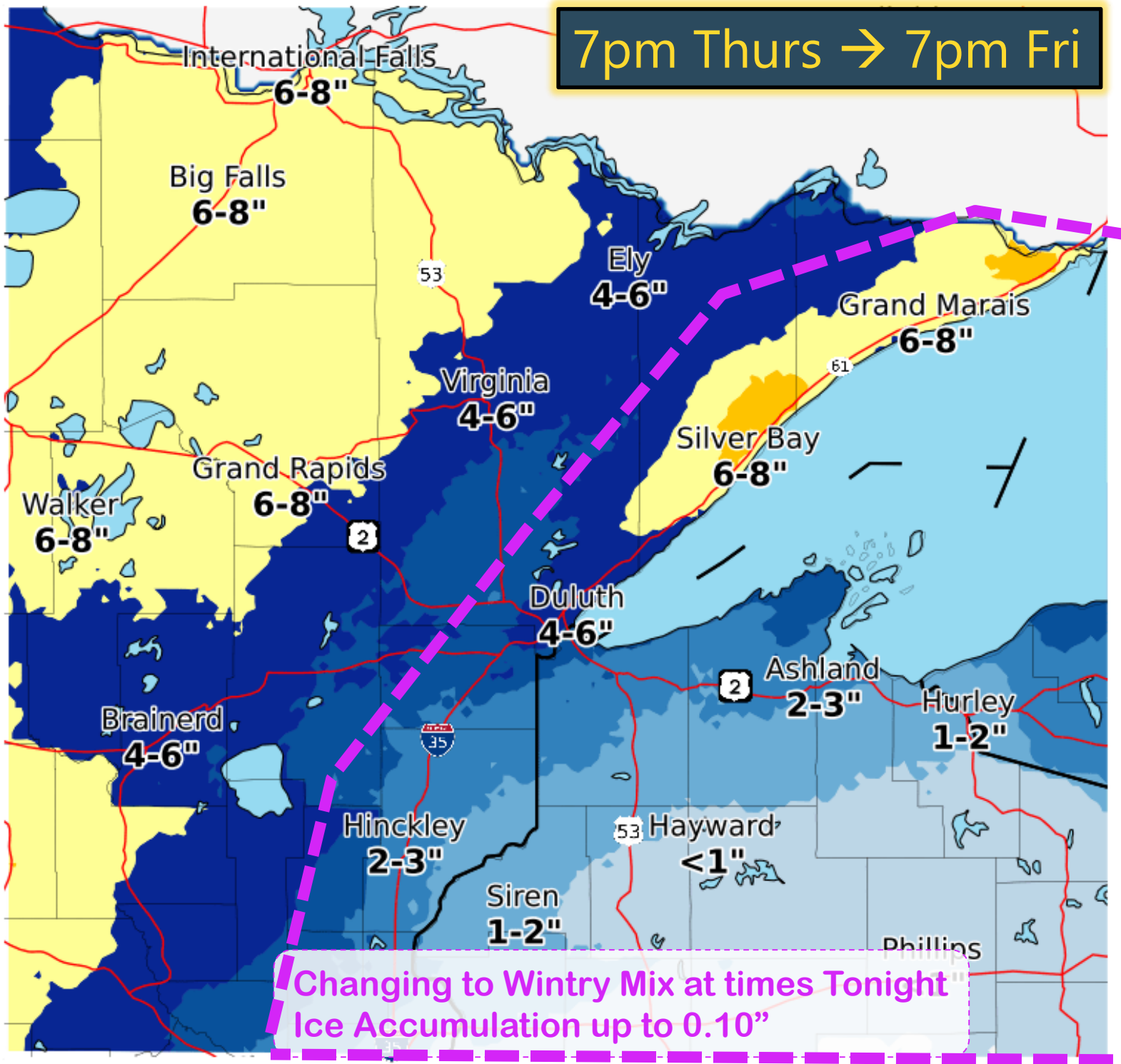

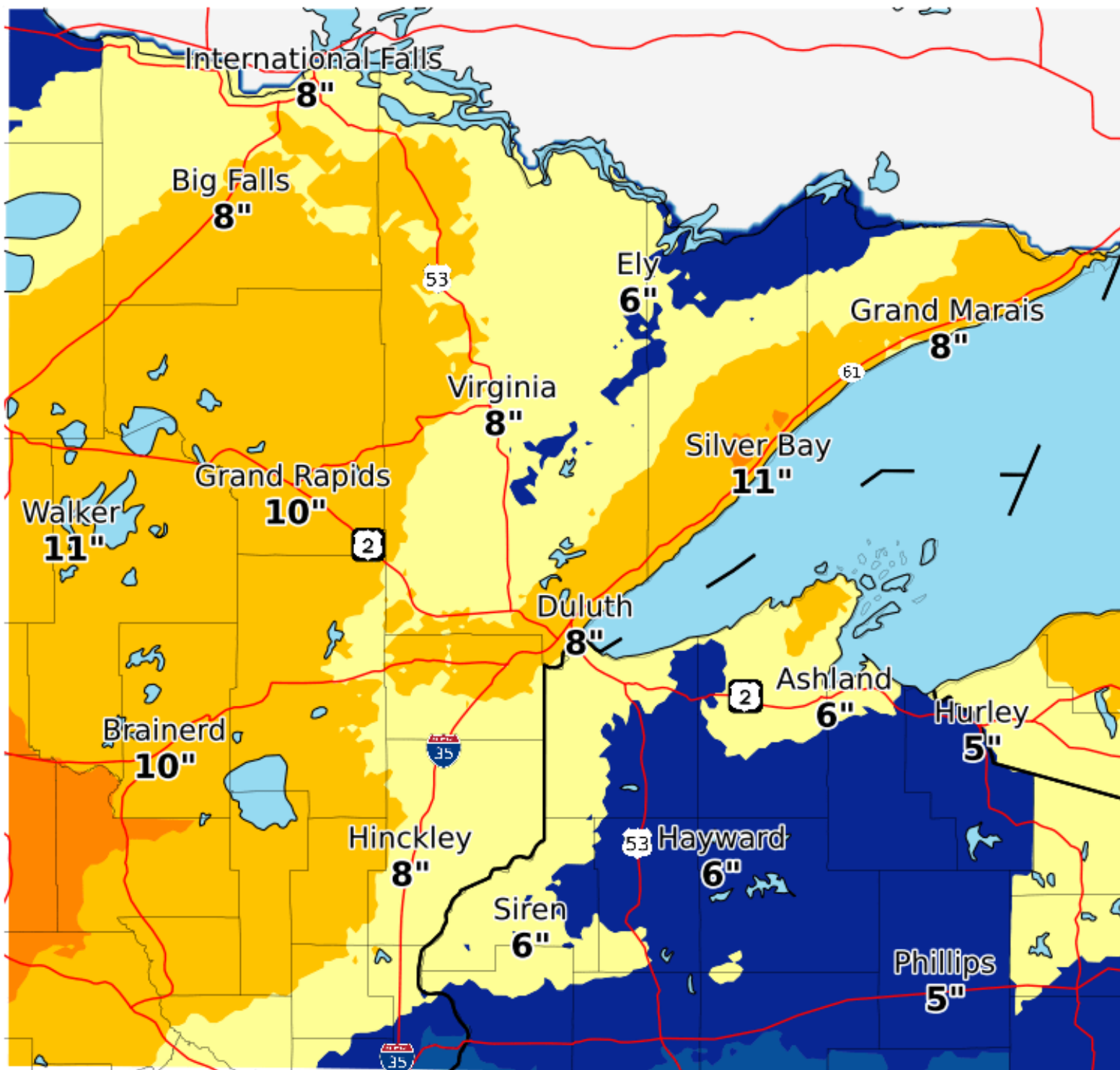

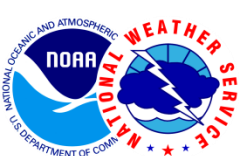

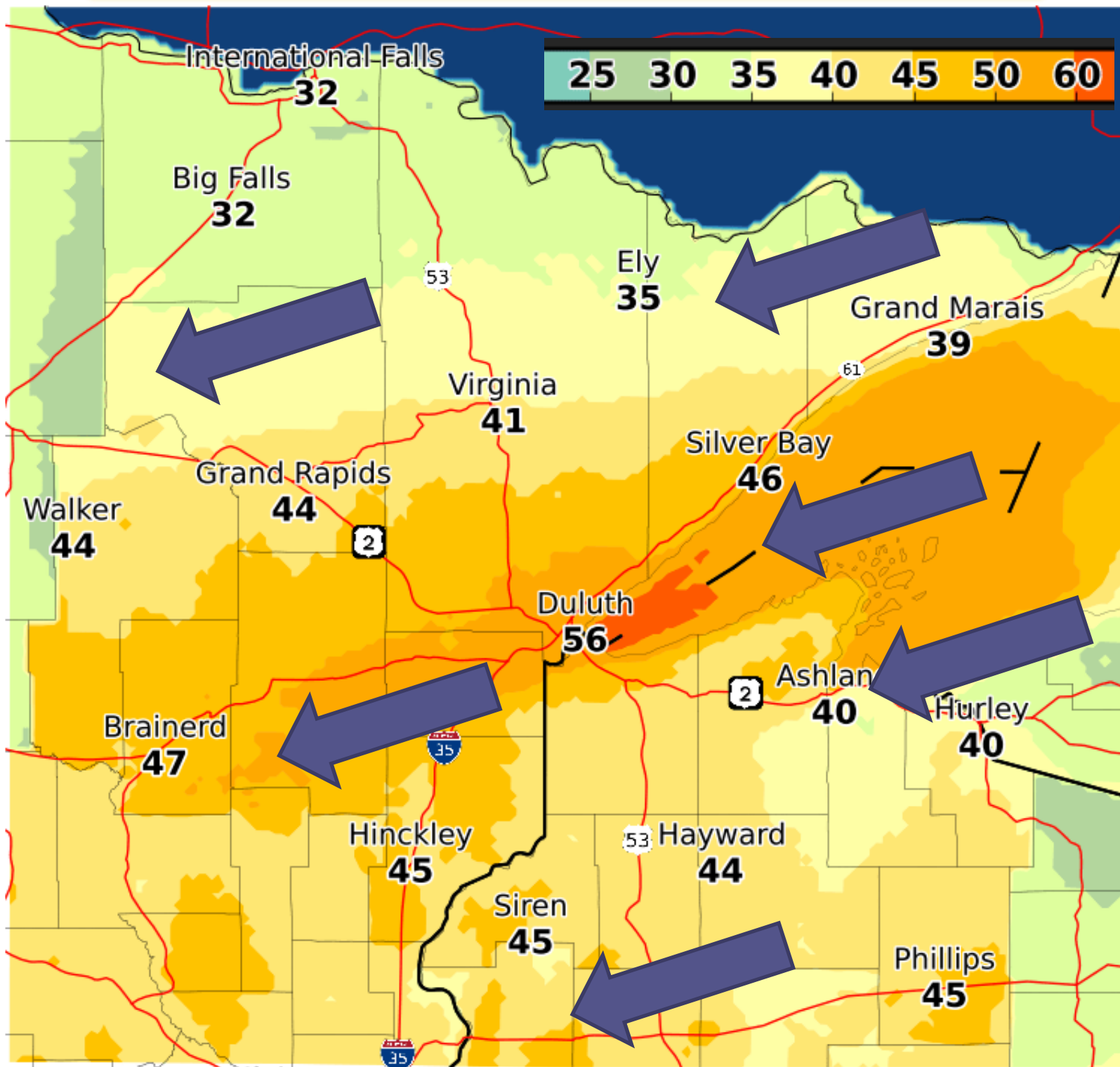
Storm Total Accumulations (Today through Friday)

Coastal Flooding & Damage Likely

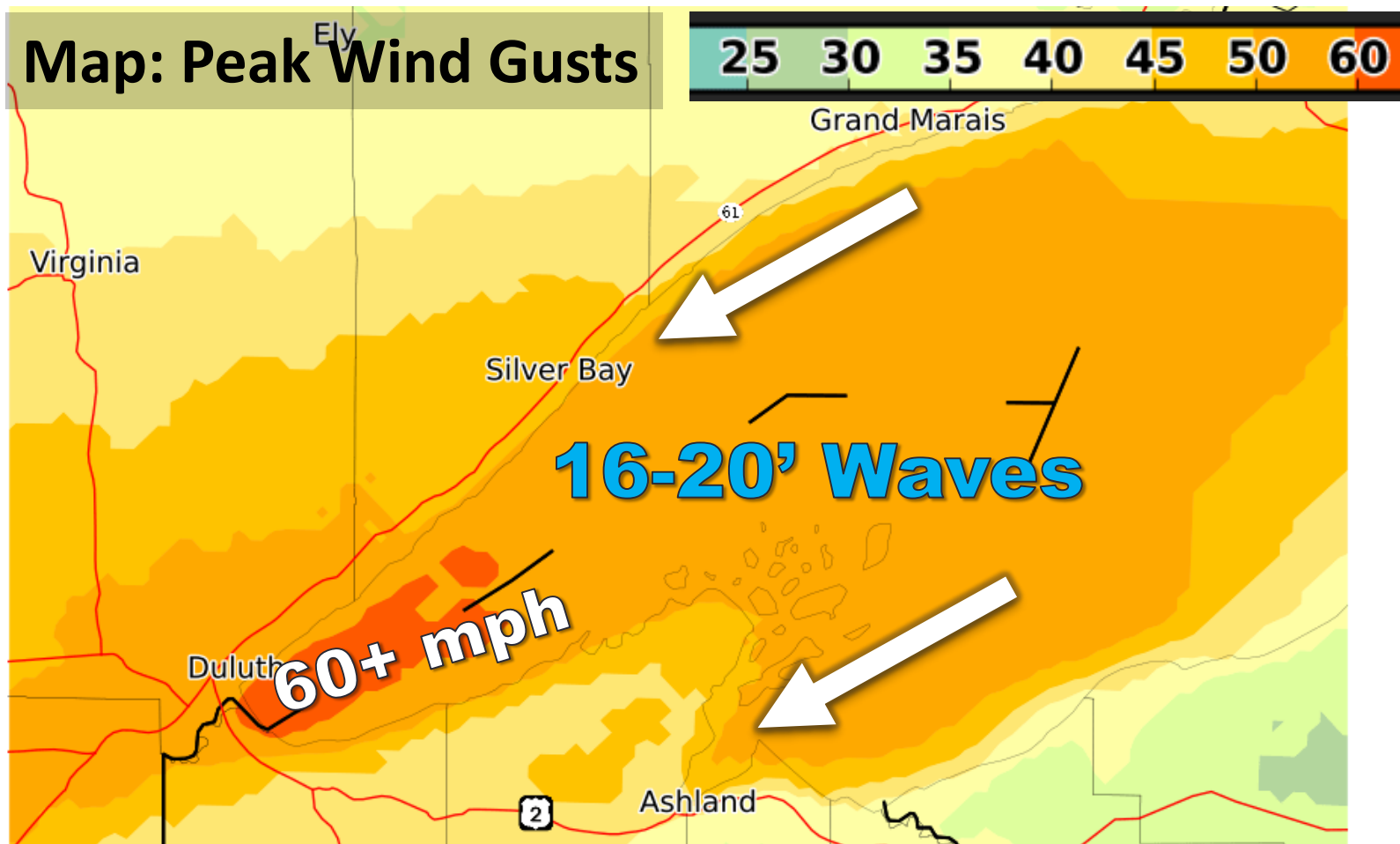


- Waves of **16-20** feet will crash on the shores of Lake Superior, which could produce flooding and damage along the lake shore
- **Stay off break walls and other shoreline structures or you could be swept away or hit by lofted chunks of ice!**

Winter Driving Safety

- Clear snow and ice from windows and lights
- Brake early. Leave twice the amount of room for stopping.
- Don't use cruise control in wintry conditions
- Don't cut in front of other vehicles
- Take it slow! Delay travel if feasible.
